But, when Habitat staff surveyed the work,

they found countless other issues that were causing problems that would only get worse with time.

Rain was pouring into her bathroom via the exhaust fan. The front porch was structurally unsafe. The roof needed shingles. There was so much rot around the doors and windows and in the bathroom.


Thankfully, you were there to help. Theresa was able to get all of this repaired at a low-cost she could afford.

Stefanie uses her gift of homeownership to foster children.

Stefanie is a helper. After college, she spent time serving with Teach for America and AmeriCorps (at Habitat!) and has spent most of her career in nonprofits. After AmeriCorps, she was still renting an apartment in Portland when she tried to realize her dream of becoming a foster parent, but she was told she didn't have a suitable living arrangement. Despite her familiarity with Habitat, it didn't occur to Stefanie to apply for a home until someone encouraged her.

Eight years later, Stefanie has opened her home to amazing children of all ages, all of whom were welcomed as members of her Habitat neighborhood. Asked what inspired her to become a foster parent, she says, "I wanted to provide children with the safety and security that I had growing up." She credits the stability of homeownership with allowing her to choose a career with flexibility to ensure she could be the best foster mom possible. "This home is a member of my family," she said with tears in her eyes.

You're helping Christina and her kids write their next chapter.

Several years ago, Christina and her kids left a bad situation and were relieved to find their current rental - a safe, peaceful place to move forward.

She thought she might be interested in a rent-to-own deal for the property, built in 1807. But it became clear that its issues - a lack of insulation, problems with the foundation, and one too many rats- would require some serious time and money that she didn't have.

At the time she found her rental, having her young son and daughter share a room didn't seem like a big deal. But as they approach their teenage years, Christina knows they need more privacy.

She credits her boss with encouraging her to apply for Habitat's affordable homeownership program in Standish. When Christina found out she'd own a home in just under a year, she was ecstatic. "I'm still having a hard time believing that it's happening."

To surprise her kids with the news, she took them to Home Depot and told them to pick out a cool key. "Once they found what they wanted and showed it to me, I said, 'you're gonna need these when we go to our new house!' They were thrilled," she recounted.

There's so much Christina is looking forward to about her new home - it will be warmer, energy-efficient, without rats, and will give her kids their own space - "...the list goes on!" she says.

And the problem with so many of these needed repairs is they lead to bigger problems. They become more costly, or even more deadly as time passes, and the repair remains untouched.


