QUALIFYING GUIDELINES FOR STANDISH HOMEOWNERSHIP

Projected Completion - 2025

How to Qualify for a Home:

Each candidate applying for Habitat homeownership is reviewed by the Family Services Committee (a Habitat volunteer group). They are evaluating your:

- need for housing
- ability to afford a monthly, low-cost mortgage payment
- willingness to work with Habitat through this process

Your ability to meet one or all of these does not guarantee you will be chosen for the program.

1. Need for Housing

Candidates must have a need for a Habitat home, including, but not limited to, one or more of the following:

- Having a high monthly housing expense relative to income
- Living in overcrowded conditions or unsafe environments
- Living with relatives, friends or in other temporary housing
- Needing accessibility features for you or a household member
- Relying on Section 8 to afford housing

Your need for housing will be assessed relative to other candidates.

2. Ability to Afford a monthly, low-cost mortgage

Income limits are determined by family size. This chart shows the most money your family can make per year based on the number of people in your household. You can make less money, but should make at least \$40,000, regardless of your family size.

The maximum allowable household income is 65% of the Greater Portland Metro MFI (Median Family Income), which is provided by the US Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Your mortgage payment is based on your income, but you must have good credit to qualify, including a credit score of 640+.

3. Willingness to work with Habitat

Candidates must show a willingness to collaborate with Habitat in the construction of their home as well as supporting the mission of Habitat in the communities where we build. Habitat home buyers are required to perform a minimum of 275 hours of "sweat equity" volunteering on Habitat projects, financial education, and community service.

Residency Requirements

All candidates must show evidence that they are US citizens or permanent residents.

- Candidates who are not U.S. citizens will need to supply copies of their status documents.
- Permanent residents will need to provide a copy of their green card. If the green card will expire in less than one year, candidate(s) must provide documents showing that the extension process has started.
- All candidates, regardless of status, must show a valid social security number issued by the Social Security Administration.
- All candidates must submit a copy of a legal photo ID (driver's license, BMV non-driver ID)
- U.S. citizens must provide a copy of a valid passport, copy of birth certificate, or copy of naturalization certificate

How the Selection Process Works

- 1. Submit a completed application and copies of your documents by Wednesday, February 19, 2025.
- 2. Your application is presented to a local community bank to determine if you can afford a Habitat home.

The bank will contact you to collect important financial information. See the checklist for a full list of documents so you can prepare them in advance.

- 3. If the bank has determined you can afford to purchase a home, the Director of Family Services will contact you to set up an in-person visit.
- 4. If your application is recommended for selection, the Habitat Board of Directors will review and approve your application for acceptance into the Habitat homeownership program.

Be patient! This entire process can take up to three months.

How to Submit Your Application

- Applications can be submitted in person or mailed to the Habitat administrative office. They cannot be submitted via email.
- Incomplete applications, missing required documentation, or late delivery will **NOT** be considered.

- All documentation provided should be copies- do not send originals, as you will not get these back.
- All sections of the application must be completed. Use N/A if a section is not applicable to you or your family.



Completed applications must be submitted no later than 4 PM on Wednesday, February 19th. Late applications will not be accepted.

CHECKLIST

Use this list below to make sure you are submitting *all* the documents required to complete your application.

- □ Written description explaining why you are applying for a Habitat home.
- □ Completed & Signed Information Request Form.
- □ <u>Copies</u> of Driver's License or State ID for adults 18+ years old ONLY (we don't need your kids' IDs unless they're 18+)
- □ Two months consecutive and current paystubs and/or Schedule C as well as Profit & Loss Statements if self-employed.
- □ Evidence of US citizenship or permanent residency.

If your application is complete, Habitat will forward your information to a local bank for review. *You do not need to call the office.* We will call you if needed.

Please be patient! You will receive a letter if your application is not accepted. We are happy to work with you to improve it for the next round.

Additional Information You'll Need to Provide Later

Our partner bank will contact you to request the following documentation:

- □ Copies of 1040 tax returns for 2023, 2022, & 2021
- □ Copies of W2's for tax years 2024, 2023, & 2022
- □ A current checking/savings bank statement
- □ Proof of rental payments (at least four months)
